What is Epidemiology?

"Epidemiology is the study of the distribution and determinants of health-related states or events in specified populations, and the application of this study to the control of health problems."- Dictionary of epidemiology.2001. p. 61

The MNA uses information from epidemiologic reports to:

- Identify health trends among Métis Albertans.
- Identify target populations for health promoting programs.
- Identify factors that prevent health and can be addressed through prevention programs.
- Identify factors that promote health and can be supported through health initiatives.
- Make evidence-based decisions about health initiatives at the MNA.
- Inform funding proposals that address the unique health profile of Métis Albertans.
- Advocate for the creation of health-related policies and programs that address the unique health profile of Métis Albertans, both federally and provincially.
