## Completing Your Family Tree

In order to become a citizen of the Métis Nation of Alberta (MNA), an up-to-date and accurate family tree is required. The MNA provides resources at our provincial office to support this requirement, and we can refer applicants to many genealogy related resources for in-person and online research.

## Genealogy Research Centre (GRC)

The Genealogy Research Centre (GRC), located at the MNA Provincial Office, holds an extensive collection of resources available to assist Métis individuals completing their family tree.

- We offer in-person assistance from 8:30 am - 3:30 pm on Wednesdays; or
- Conduct your own research Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday from 8:30 am - 3:30 pm by appointment only.
