
ANNUAL BIRD HARVEST SURVEY

PROJECT GOALS



GATHER INFORMATION

on the numbers and types of birds harvested by Métis Citizens

INFORM MANAGEMENT

by providing information to Canadian Wildlife Service to set limits on non-Indigenous harvests

PROTECT HARVESTING RIGHTS

by gaining an understanding of how/where Citizens exercise their rights



THIS SURVEY COLLECTS **AND RECORDS:**

- The number and species of migratory and upland game birds harvested by Métis in Alberta
- Unique names Métis Citizens use for birds they harvest in Alberta

PILOT SURVEY

- 332 Métis Citizens completed the survey
- 1,369 birds from 24 different species were reported harvested from 36 Wildlife Management Units
- 20 out of the 29 surveyed species have unique names used by Métis Harvesters

Compared to the previous year:

17% increase in response

180% increase in bird harvests reported

+ 10 species surveyed

SURVEY RESULTS

- → Continuation of 2019 with inclusion of upland game birds
- 390 Métis Citizens completed the survey
- 3,829 total birds from 34 different species were reported harvested from 90 Wildlife Management Units
- Over 90% of surveyed species have unique names used by Métis Harvesters

SURVEY RESULTS

- 496 Métis Citizens completed the survey
- 4,257 total birds from 34 different species were
- Over 90% of surveyed species have

Compared to the previous year:

28% increase in response

11% increase in bird harvests reported

- reported harvested from 112 Wildlife Management Units
- unique names used by Métis Harvesters
