ROSS 'MEMPHIS' PAMBRUN

Ross 'MEMPHIS' Pambrun is a talented, spirited, and engaging individual who uses humour and storytelling to enhance his varied speaking engagements. Ross recently spoke at the 'Wall Street Journal Future of Everything Festival' in NYC about the social progress of Artificial Intelligence.

An Indigenous Métis business leader, Ross is also the CEO of an award-winning cyber innovation company, The Memphis Group, who uses artificial intelligence derived approaches to protect communities around the globe.

Ross proudly wears medals awarded from the Province of Alberta and City of Calgary for his 24+ years of service as a professional firefighter. A popular emcee with experience as an international actor and musician, he is skilled at connecting everyone in a room.

Ross completed a 100-podcast-episode series interviewing guests from diverse backgrounds and is the lead host of a 13 episode Treasure Hunting TV show 'Red River Gold' released on May 5, 2025. Watch for the show on national broadcaster APTN.

SQUARE DANCE SHOWCASE



CREELAND DANCERS

The Creeland Dancers are one of Western Canada's longest-serving Indigenous square dance groups, known for their unique fusion of Métis jigging, traditional dances, and square dancing. Founded 41 years ago by Cree and Métis Elders Therese Seesequasis and her late husband Ken, the group performs at festivals, schools, and cultural events with a mission to foster cross-cultural understanding and pride in Indigenous identity. Their shows are high-energy, entertaining, and enriching cultural experiences.

SQUARE DANCE SHOWCASE



KIKINO NORTHERN LITES

The Kikino Northern Lites is a Métis traditional dance troupe founded in 1978 by Elders Georgina Thompson and Doris Bellerose. Named for the Cree word "Kikino" (our home) and the Métis belief that spirits dance in the northern lights, the group was led by Gerald White and his wife Denise, who dedicated their lives to preserving Métis culture through music and dance. After Gerald's passing in 2006, the group went quiet until 2023, when his son Trevor White, inspired by the birth of his daughter, revived the troupe to continue sharing Métis traditions with future generations.



NORTHERN PRAIRIE

The Northern Prairie Dancers bring a high-energy showcase of traditional Métis jigging and prairie square dance—two deeply rooted dance forms that continue to unite communities across the northern plains. Known for their vibrant style, precise footwork, and spirited group performances, the troupe offers a lively celebration of culture, history, and community through movement. Blending traditional Métis styles with community-driven square dance, the group highlights the living spirit of prairie dance traditions passed down through generations and still thriving today. Their performances are a tribute to resilience, celebration, and the shared joy of movement.



UNITED THUNDER

United Thunder is a vibrant Indigenous square dance group rooted in the Red River Jig and traditional square dancing, formed to share and preserve cultural traditions. Hailing from rural Manitoba communities like Sandy Bay, Crane River, and The Pas, they celebrate Indigenous pride through high-energy performances. Blending modern flair with time-honoured moves, United Thunder honors the rich legacy of First Nations and Métis communities, captivating audiences with their dynamic rhythms and spirited dancing.

JASON LEPINE

Jason Lepine is a self-taught Métis fiddle champion and recording artist from Portage la Prairie, now based in Winnipeg. He began playing the fiddle at age 7, learning by ear from his father, Garry Lepine, a fellow fiddling legend. In 2020, both were inducted into the Manitoba Fiddle Wall of Fame. Known for his energetic and heartfelt Métis fiddling style, Jason is a regular performer with Red River Jigging and Square Dance groups, and has won numerous competitions including the Manitoba Championship and Festival du Voyageur. He also teaches, judges contests, and plays for a wide variety of events.

Throughout his career, Jason has performed across Canada and in the U.S., with highlights including the Celtic Colors International Festival, Métis Back to Batoche Days, and Keplinfest. He's opened for notable acts such as Donnell Leahy, Natalie McMaster, and Doc Walker. In 2014, he won "Best Fiddle Album of the Year" at the Aboriginal People's Choice Music Awards. Jason has released three albums: "Hearsay", "Drivin' Force", and "Métis Flair", continuing to share and celebrate Métis culture through music.

DONNY PARENTEAU

Donny Parenteau is a proud Métis Country Music artist, born and raised in Prince Albert, Saskatchewan. Donny is a multi-instrumentalist, a singer-songwriter, and is one of the most nominated Independent acts in Canada.

Donny spent 12 years touring the world with Neal McCoy, recording on multi-platinum selling albums, and played on numerous shows with performances on The Grand Ole Opry, and The Tonight Show with Jay Leno.

After starting his solo career in 2003, Donny has garnered more than 100 nominations at 7 major awards shows, which include 3 Juno nominations, and his first USA nomination for Best Country CD at the 2014 Native American Music Awards. His latest CD, Bring It On, is the only CD placed in a time capsule at the Regina Legislative Building, to be opened in 100 years, because of Donny's song Deep In the Heart of Saskatchewan.

Donny's latest singles from 2020 to 2024 have all been added to the Indigenous Music Countdown, and made it to the top five spots, while also being played on Sirius 165- Indigiverse. Parenteau's last 4 singles have all reached #1 on MBC Saskatchewan's Indigenous Countdown, and his latest single, It's All I Need, went #1 on the Indigenous Music Countdown top 40 across Canada. Today, Donny continues to teach music at his Donny Parenteau School of Music, and performs with his band across Canada.

INTERPRETIVE ACTIVITIES - JUNE 14, 11 AM TO 6 PM

Métis Crossing strives to share the distinct Indigenous story of the Métis people through experiential or hands-on cultural experiences. Our cultural experiences provide opportunities for unique interactions on the land sharing Métis ways of life with visitors. For Alberta Métis Fest we have invited Métis Experience Providers from across Alberta to share and celebrate Métis traditions and culture with you.

Hide Tanning Demonstration

The traditional process of hide tanning is an important skill that honours the animal, connects us to culture, and transforms a hide into valuable materials for a wide range of uses. From fleshing and dry scraping to braining and smoking, each stage requires different skills and tools, offering participants hands-on opportunities to explore some tanning techniques and learn from a variety of hides.

Leather Crafting

Dive into the timeless art of leather crafting with our introductory workshop designed specifically for beginners. Throughout this hands-on program, participants will learn the essential skills and techniques needed to create beautiful leather goods from scratch.

The workshop will cover the basics of working with leather, including understanding different types of leather, essential tools and materials, and safety precautions. Participants will have the opportunity to practice fundamental techniques such as cutting, stitching, and edge finishing, gradually building their confidence and proficiency.

By the end of the workshop, beginners will have gained a solid foundation in leather crafting and completed their first handmade leather creations, ready to embark on further exploration and mastery of this rewarding craft. Join us and unlock your creativity with leather crafting!

Archery/Slingshots

Step into the shoes of traditional Métis hunters as you learn the art of archery. Under the guidance of skilled instructors, participants will have the opportunity to practice their aim and technique with bows and arrows. Discover the significance of archery in Métis culture, where it was once a vital skill for survival and sustenance.

Traditional Skills - Shelter Building

Shelter building will involve learning some basic knots, a short discussion on materials and types of shelters and then setting up a tarp shelter.

Moose Meat Smoking

Join Ron Quintal for a traditional Métis culinary experience as he smokes moose meat using time-honored techniques. Participants will learn about the importance of moose hunting in Métis culture and the art of preserving meat through smoking. Discover the flavors and aromas of smoked moose meat while gaining insight into Métis hunting traditions and culinary practices.

INTERPRETIVE ACTIVITIES - JUNE 14, 11 AM TO 6 PM

Bannock Making

Bannock was originally brought to Canada by the Scottish explorers and traders. Indigenous and Métis people adopted this style of bread over the 18th and 19th centuries, once upon a time corn flour and plants were used in place of wheat. We still use this method of traditional Bannock making today.

Fish Scale Art

Delve into the world of Métis artistry with fish scale art, a traditional craft that dates back generations. Participants will have the opportunity to create stunning works of art using fish scales, a unique and sustainable material. Learn various techniques and designs inspired by Métis culture and create your own masterpiece to take home as a memento of the experience.

Buffalo Camp

Immerse yourself in the atmosphere of a traditional Métis buffalo camp, where life revolved around the hunt and the buffalo provided sustenance, clothing, and shelter. Explore replicas of traditional dwellings, hear stories of Métis hunters and their deep connection to the land and the buffalo, and gain insight into the cultural practices and traditions of buffalo hunting.

Life on a River Lot Homestead

Step back in time and explore the daily life of Métis families on the river lot. Visit a recreated river lot home and see firsthand how Métis families lived, worked, and thrived along Alberta's waterways. Gain insight into traditional Métis architecture, household chores, and domestic activities that were integral to river lot life.

Veterans Monument

The Métis Veterans Monument stands as a powerful tribute to the brave Métis men and women who served in Canada's armed forces. More than a marker of military service, it honours a legacy of courage, sacrifice, and unshakable identity. As you stand before the monument, you are invited to reflect on the stories of those who fought for a country that did not always fight for them—individuals who carried the strength of their ancestors and the pride of their Nation into every battle.

This monument is a symbol of recognition long overdue, and a place for all generations to remember, learn, and give thanks. It reminds us that Métis contributions to Canada's history are not just chapters in the past—they are living stories that continue to shape our shared future.

Ron Dominique is a celebrated Métis artist whose work breathes life into traditional Métis culture through intricate and thought-provoking imagery.
