Re: Mandate Letter for Métis Settlement & First Nation Relations & Language Revitalization

Dear Secretary Collins,

It is my pleasure to reaffirm your appointment as Provincial Secretary to the Cabinet of the Otipemisiwak Métis Government, holding the portfolio of Secretary of Métis Settlement & First Nation Relations & Language Revitalization.

As a Provincial Secretary and member of Cabinet, you hold a critical role in advancing our Nation's priorities and serving Métis Citizens across Alberta. Your leadership, alongside your colleagues, will help drive progress on key initiatives, including the negotiation of a modern Treaty to secure and protect our rights and self-determination; a historic opportunity to benefit current and future generations. At a time of shifting political landscapes both federally and provincially, your work must be strategic, adaptable, and rooted in our Constitution's vision of fairness, accountability, and the advancement of Métis self-government in Alberta. Together, we will uphold these principles while ensuring our laws and policies reflect the needs of Citizens in all five Métis Territories and beyond.

The Otipemisiwak Métis Government is committed to strengthening our Nation-to-Nation and government-to-government relationships, asserting our jurisdiction, and delivering programs that improve the lives of Métis families and communities. As both an ambassador and key part of the executive branch of this government, as well as in a renewed focus on developing our governance framework here at home, your portfolio will play a vital role in shaping our future. As outlined in the Self-Government Act, you will collaborate with the Citizens' Council, engage meaningfully with Citizens, and ensure transparent decision-making that aligns with our collective goals. The path to a modern Treaty requires unity, persistence, and bold leadership; qualities I know you will bring to this role.

I am confident that your dedication will help us meet these challenges and seize the opportunities ahead. By working with integrity and purpose, you contribute to a stronger, more self-sufficient Métis government that honours our past while building a brighter future. Thank you for stepping forward in service to our people, and I look forward to achieving meaningful progress together.

With respect to your portfolio area, over the next 12 months, you are empowered with the following mandate:

- Strengthen Métis Settlement Relations by supporting the establishment of formal governmentto-government agreements that respect the unique status of Settlements while advancing our shared priorities.
- 2. **Build First Nation Partnerships** through regular leadership dialogues and collaborative initiatives that honor our shared histories and territories.
- Advance Indigenous Language Revitalization Initiatives by collaborating with Administration to support a Michif Language Revitalization Plan, as well as other language initiatives to ensure the development of immersion programs, digital learning tools, and intergenerational language transmission initiatives, based on funding availability.
- 4. **Advocate for Federal Language Funding** by supporting Administration negotiations related to Canada's implementation of the Indigenous Languages Act in support of Michif and Cree language initiatives.
- 5. Renew Relationships with Alberta Native Friendship Centres by collaborating with Administration to develop and renew a Memorandum of Understanding between the Otipemisiwak Métis Government and the Alberta Native Friendship Centres Association.

In your role, you will have support from and liaise with the Office of the President, and the Intergovernmental Relations and Self-Government Departments through their associated Directors and Department heads.

As you move forward in this vital role, remember that your leadership is part of a greater journey; one shaped by the resilience of our ancestors and the dreams of future generations. The work ahead will demand courage, creativity, and unwavering commitment to our Nation, our Citizens, and our Government; but it is through this collective effort that we will secure true self-determination, protect our rights, and build a thriving Métis Nation within Alberta. I have every confidence in your ability to rise to this challenge with integrity and heart. Together, let us honor our past, serve our people, and forge a legacy of strength and unity. *Marsee*, thank you, for answering this call to leadership.
